Though our offices are physically closed and we have shifted *how* we are delivering our English classes as well as employment and settlement services, our dedication to supporting all members of our community has never been stronger.

Through our conversations with our members over these past weeks, we know that our community is relying on us now more than ever. We know that many of the women in our senior English class are especially vulnerable during this pandemic crisis because they don't have access to the technology they need to connect virtually with their classmates and to overcome the negative social impacts of physical isolation.
